Love and Justice: The Two Greatest Commandments

If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?



Love to God will be shown by acts of love toward other people

Sunday — The Two Greatest Com

Matthew 22:34-40

What did Jesus regard as the two greatest commandments?



Suggested Answer: Love to God reflected in all activities and love to others as oneself.

Matthew 19:16-23

What was this man lacking in terms of keeping God's commandments?



Suggested Answer: He loved his wealth more than God and his comfort more than that of the poor.

Monday — The Two Greatest Sins

Psalm 135:13-19

What sin results from not loving God with heart, soul and mind?



Suggested Answer: Idolatry. Putting other things, such as human creations in place of God.

Zechariah 7:9-12

What sin results from not loving others as oneself?



Suggested Answer: Absence of justice, compassion and mercy. May be described as selfishness.

Tuesday — God Loves Justice

Psalm 33:5

What evidence does the psalmist give that God does not approve of injustice?



Suggested Answer: The earth is full of the goodness of God. All around are evidences of His love for all.

Isaiah 61:8

How much does God value justice — treating other fairly?



Suggested Answer: He hates robbery — even if done for the purpose of presenting offerings to Him.

Wednesday — Called to Establish Justice

Isaiah 1:14-17

How important is it to God that His people treat others with justice?



Suggested Answer: He declares that He hates even prayers and the services He established when accompanied by deeds of injustice.

Matthew 23:23-30

What actions brought Jesus declarations of coming woe?



Suggested Answer: Even strict obedience to details of the law while neglecting greater matter such as mercy and faith

Thursday — Who Is My Neighbor?

Luke 10:25-29

What did this lawyer ask as he sought to show himself worthy of eternal life?



He asked Fesus who should be considered neighbors? How broad should this be understood to be?

Luke 10:36-37

What did Jesus indicate was the better question to ask?



Suggested Answer: Who can I be a neighbor to?
